- Offer my services as a tutor to both Scholars and non-Scholars students

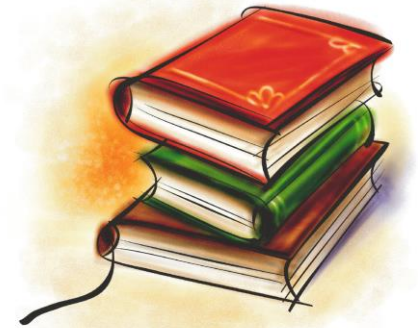
